Holly Greaves is the Chief Administrative Officer of the Edison Electric Institute (EEI), the association that represents all U.S. investor-owned electric companies. As CAO, she oversees a cross-functional team that includes the Center for Energy Workforce Development, employment testing, human resources, information technology, and internal accounting.

Prior to joining EEI, Greaves served as Chief Financial Officer of the Public Company Accounting Oversight Board (PCAOB), which oversees the audits of public companies and SEC-registered brokers and dealers. At PCAOB, she directed the development of the PCAOB's annual operating budget of approximately \$400 million. Greaves received the PCAOB Circle of Excellence award in 2025 for her contributions.

Before PCAOB, Greaves was unanimously confirmed by the U.S. Senate to serve as CFO of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), where she led a team of several hundred professionals to ensure the effective management and financial integrity of EPA's resources and annual budget. She was responsible for preparing the agency's annual financial statements, financial systems, annual budget and performance plan, and strategic plan. She also led the agency's enterprise risk management efforts.

Earlier in her career, Greaves worked with the public accounting firm KPMG, leading and directing the work of multi-disciplinary and geographically diverse teams that provided auditing and advisory services.

Greaves earned a B.S. in accounting and Master of Accountancy from the University of Tennessee. She has lectured for undergraduate and graduate level accounting courses at George Washington University and is a licensed CPA.
