# EEI Board Announces Drew Maloney as Incoming President and Chief Executive Officer

EEI announced that Drew Maloney has been named President and Chief Executive Officer, effective July 1, 2025. He succeeds interim President and CEO Pat Vincent-Collawn.

"Drew Maloney's extensive public policy expertise, financial and energy sector work, and trade association leadership will be a tremendous asset to EEI member companies and the millions of customers we serve," said EEI Board Chair Maria Pope.

Maloney joins EEI from the American Investment Council, where he has served as President and CEO since 2018, building a reputation for effective industry advocacy and strategic leadership, including efforts to promote investment in American energy production and critical infrastructure.

# EEI Encourages the Senate to Pass the Fix Our Forests Act

Earlier this year, EEI interim President and CEO Pat Vincent-Collawn congratulated the U.S. House of Representatives for passing the Fix Our Forests Act. This month, she issued the following statement urging the Senate to do the same:

"Catastrophic wildfires are affecting more regions of the country, making it imperative to do more to prevent wildfires before they happen. EEI and our member electric companies applaud Senators John Curtis, John Hickenlooper, Alex Padilla, and Tim Sheehy for introducing the Fix Our Forests Act, which will enhance land management practices and better prepare and protect communities that could be affected by fires.

We urge the Senate to pass this important legislation and deliver the Fix Our Forests Act to President Donald Trump's desk as soon as possible."

Other projects that could affect utility lines and require calling 8-1-1 first include planting trees and shrubs or installing a septic tank, swimming pool, or sprinkler system.
